We achieve these goals through programming that blends carefully crafted curriculum with college and career pathways to help young people move toward their career goals. Facilitated group and individual mentoring, combined with targeted instruction, are core components of our approach. Our Workforce Development Program, now available for both college and career pathways, strengthens our ability to support all youth in achieving economic success.

## **MEET SHAREFEST**

Youth meet their Instructor Mentors and build relationships. They participate in initial classes and workshops.

## **LEVI**

## FROM HOMELESSNESS TO LA HARBOR COLLEGE

Levi faced intense pressures throughout his youth, from bouncing between schools, being separateed from his mom and even experiencing homelessness. These hardships could have crushed him, but instead, Levi learned to harness the strength that pressure can create.

His turning point came at Avalon, where he connected with Sharefest. We helped him gain essential skills, and provided mentorship and support. Through Sharefest's guidance, Levi became a high school graduate, enrolled in LA Harbor College, and now aims to enter the electrical lineman program at LA Trade Tech.

Levi's story is one of resilience, proving that even the hardest challenges can be transformed into stepping stones toward a bright future.

## **GRADUATE**

Our goal is for youth to graduate with a career plan and have a pathway highlighted to community college or university, trade program, internship or job.

Alan struggled to stay motivated in school and found himself drastically behind on the credits he needed to graduate. At Angel's Gate Continuation High School he was able to rediscover his love of learning and graduate.

Alan was invited to join Sharefest's Career Connections Summer Internship Program where he learned how to present himself professionally, network and prepare for a career of interest. Through the internship, Alan was connected to the Cedars-Sinai LADDERS program. He successfully completed the program and was connected with professionals who are committed to helping him achieve his goal of becoming an IOR Inspector.

Now, Alan is feeling hopeful about his future and his career path. He credits Sharefest for helping him use the skills and passions he already had in new and impactful ways and looks forward to continuing his career journey.



## INEZ

#### FROM OVERWHELMED YOUTH TO DETERMINED DREAMER

Inez always felt like life wouldn't be easy. Growing up, she faced trauma and overwhelming emotions, yet her family's love and the independence of the strong women around her inspired resilience. In high school, her struggles led to poor grades and, eventually, expulsion. Sent to Angel's Gate, she felt out of place—until she met Ms. Phonnyta, Sharefest Instructor Mentor, whose care helped Inez regain trust, focus on her studies, and graduate a year early.

Through Sharefest's Career Connections Internship, Inez gained confidence and clarity about her future, with goals like getting her driver's license and pursuing her love for art, architecture, and design. Now, with Sharefest's support, Inez sees her mental strength as a powerful asset.

Inez says, "Remember: Despite what anyone will tell you, you were made for more, your mental health doesn't have to be your weakness, it can be your strength, and you can overcome whatever you put your mind to."

## NATALIE

## FROM OVERLOOKED TO UNCOVERED GEM

Growing up, Natalie felt overshadowed and labeled as just another statistic, but she was determined to change that. In high school, a difficult situation nearly led her to juvenile detention, but instead, she ended up at Avalon Continuation High School, where she connected with Sharefest and our Instructor Mentor Mr. G, who introduced her to new possibilities.

With Sharefest's support, Natalie completed years of credits in record time and adopted a mantra, "Stick to the plan," which became her guide to success. Through Sharefest's Career Connections Internship, she gained practical skills, confidence, and a community of peers with big dreams, helping her see her own potential.

Today, Natalie is a proud high school graduate, a full-time student at LA Harbor College, and a Sharefest Ambassador. She shared her story at our Hidden Gems Gala this fall and is driven to help other young people uncover their own hidden gems.

## **MIGUEL**

## FROM STRUGGLING STUDENT TO CONSTRUCTION INTERN

Miguel faced early struggles with school, losing motivation during the COVID shutdown and later battling social anxiety, which caused him to fall behind in credits. Determined to graduate, Miguel transferred to Simon Rodia Continuation High School, where he worked hard to stay on track.

His turning point came when he connected with Sharefest. Our Instructor Mentors introduced him to career paths, including becoming an electrician. Through Sharefest's Career Connections Summer Intership, Miguel gained professional skills and landed another internship with Cedars-Sinai. After his successful completion of the LADDERS internship, Miguel accepted an apprenticeship position with Eco-Mac Electric.

Today, Miguel is excited about his future, showing that with the right guidance and determination, even difficult beginnings can lead to a promising career path.




# **IMPACTS & OUTCOMES**



# CEDARS-SINAI LADDERS TO SUCCESS PROGRAM

This summer marked the second year of our partnership with Cedars-Sinai. Youth had the opportunity to interview and several were selected for the 11-week Cedars-Sinai LADDERS of Success Internship. This program provided hands-on training in a variety of construction and engineering environments -- making them immediately hireable!

The LADDERS program exposed them to a wide range of skills from essential construction terminology and understanding structural integrity to complex lighting design. Each youth discovered a trade that matched their interests. For example, Alan developed an interest in becoming an IOR Inspector while Priscilla was drawn to organizational collaboration.

The best part? Every Sharefest youth who was selected successfully completed the program and all were offered jobs! Our partnership with Cedars-Sinai is just one of the many ways Sharefest prepares youth for and connects them to real-world careers.

# **PRISCILLA**FROM INSTABILITY TO A PROMISING CAREER



Her turning point came when she enrolled at Angel's Gate Continuation High School and joined Sharefest, where our Instructor Mentors helped her build essential career skills. With their guidance, she was accepted into and graduated from the Cedars-Sinai LADDERS to Success Program.

Upon completing the program, Priscilla was offered a full-time role as a project assistant at TIS Construction. She is now training in estimation and looking forward to a bright future.

Now a successful Credit Analyst at Pacific Premier Bank, Jose returned this summer to help lead Pacific Premier's "Game of Life" youth program.



He took her up on it and she followed him from school to school, leading workdays and volunteering until he was promoted.

Still wanting to volunteer with students, Debi reached out to Chad, and he connected her with Harry Bridges Span School, where she continues to volunteer today. Sharefest has also helped Debi facilitate many service projects at Harry Bridges.

When we asked Debi why she continues to support Sharefest faithfully, she shared, "I appreciate Chad and his heart for underserved students. I understand their emphasis on mentoring kids and letting them know someone really cares about them. I love Sharefest's vision and the way they are able to provide the tools, resources, and opportunities youth need to succeed."

As a retired teacher who volunteers with elementary kids from similar backgrounds as Sharefest youth, Debi gets a firsthand look into what mentoring means to students. She believes mentoring makes a difference because students see there is someone who knows their name, cares about them, believes in them and puts in time and effort to encourage and help them. Debi sees tremendous value in a mentor coming alongside a student and saying, 'You've got this! I care about you and I will be here for you.'

Debi has seen the difference Sharefest's work is making in youth's lives. She hopes Sharefest can expand to serve more youth, as she knows the need is great. Additionally, Debi hopes Sharefest can grow our partnerships with industry partners to further the effectiveness of our work.
